For the fourth in its
series of exhibitions dedicated to great rulers,
the British Museum concentrates on the last
Aztec emperor, Moctezuma II, who
reigned between 1502 and 1520.
Regarded as semi-divine by his
subjects, Moctezuma was a battlehardened general who built a new palace and
reinstated the court. Exhibits include works
commissioned by Moctezuma, such as the
monument, 'Teocalli of Sacred Warfare', and
paintings detailing the Spanish conquest.
